hand washing and hygiene. 95% of our students have now returned.


We have also had a number of new enrolments and I would like to welcome the new families to our school.

Keeping Ourselves Safe Programme

Early next term we are doing the Keeping Ourselves Safe programme. Keeping Ourselves Safe is a personal safety programme designed by the New Zealand Police. It enables children to learn and

apply a range of safety skills that they can use when interacting with others. Students recognise the differences between healthy and unhealthy relationships, and those who have been or are being abused are encouraged to seek help.

Keeping Ourselves Safe will be taught by your child's teacher with support from the local Police Education Officer – Senior Constable Carl.









To be successful, Keeping Ourselves Safe needs your help and support. Your child will have homework activities to work on with you. It is important that you participate as often as possible and talk to your child about what they have been learning. This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving, and help your child to use his or her new skills with confidence.
