Kelston Visioning Survey



The schools involved are Kelston Primary School, St. Leonards Primary school, Kelston Intermediate School, Kelston Girls' College, Kelston Boys' High School and Kelston Deaf Education Centre.

In this concept, schools would collaborate on a shared Kelston Learning Village in which the intermediate school and secondary schools could co-locate on a single shared site, and would work closely with the primary schools.

Camp 2020 - Carey Park

Next year all of our Year 5 & 6 students (this year's Year 4 & 5 students) are booked in for camp at Carey Park in Henderson Valley. Traditionally we have held this camp every two years in May, next year we have been very lucky to get a summer slot and we are booked in for Monday 17 February until Wednesday 19 February. This two night, three-day camp is action-packed with activities ranging from kayaking and waterhole swimming to orienteering and raft building. The total cost is \$200 per student with school-wide fundraising covering the balance (actual cost is \$240). This covers transport to the camp, all food starting from afternoon tea on the Monday, all activities (at least 10) including qualified instructors for the key ones, accommodation for 2 nights, plus outdoor education workshops back at school on Thursday 20 February and a firelighting/cooking experience on Friday 21 February. The permission notice was sent home last week. It is appreciated if these are completed and returned asap. With camp being so early in term 1, 2020 we need to have most things organised by the end of this year. This means that there will be a number of notices coming home in the coming weeks that will need your attention. These will include health and dietary requirement forms, parent helper forms and information on how individuals can fundraise to reduce the \$200 amount even more. Exciting times ahead!

Over the next few weeks, we have two interschool sporting events to compete in. First up we have the interschool netball tournament on Thursday 19th September. We are taking four Yr 5/6 teams (3 girls and 1 boys team). This tournament is being held at Te Pai Courts in Henderson. On Tuesday 24th September, we have the Western Zone Girls Cricket Tournament at Riversdale Reserve. We are taking three Yr 5/6 teams and two Yr 3/4 teams. All the teams are busily training in preparation for these events. Those students that are in teams will receive a notice this week.
